
# 2010 "Misses": What we did not achieve - yet

- Simplify rule book and clean up DQ rules among other items
- · By-laws changes to:
  - Move July I agenda item deadline to a later date (using the IBS web site to provide official notice)
  - Such action would NOT affect Precision Shooting as our "official publication".
- · AR class did not take off.

# **Benchrest's Place Amongst Shooting Sports**

Benchrest is, and will be, a niche shooting sport, BUT...

- · There is a need to grow Benchrest
  - √ Too important in terms of technology to remain an "underground" shooting sport
  - ✓ Need to have critical mass of shooters for matches clubs need to survive
  - ✓ "Benchrest" is a valuable brand earned over the decades
  - $\checkmark$  Benchrest is recognized as contributing to rifle development via "trickle-down"
  - √ The challenges of our sport need to be explained, but not made so daunting


- 549 shooters filled out the benchrest survey
- 435 non-benchresters responded to the survey








# **BR Shooters Responses**

- Lower costs to shoot








- F-Class, more shooting, simpler

- Some remarked about some benchresters attitudes


BR Shooters Responses

•96% said YES (517 votes!)


