IBS Annual Membership Meeting

The 46th Annual membership meeting of the International Benchrest shooters was held on January 16&17,2015 at the Holiday Inn Harrisburg-Hershey, Grantville, Pa. The meeting was called to order at 9:00 by President Jeff Stover. A moment of silence was observed.

A roll call was held to determine a quorun. Joan Borden gave the Recording Secretary report. Membership as of January 14, 2015 is 943. Joan reported that \$46287.76 was turned over to the Treasurer.

The Treasurers report was given by Bill Gebhardt. The organizations finances are more stable as a result of not paying for subscriptions to Prescision Shooting magazine.

The IBS Secretarial and Treasurer's books had been audited by independent auditors. At the meeting Mike Wallace and Gary Long audited both sets of books. Gary Long stated that both sets of books were in order.

First VP and Match Chairman Dick Grosbier reported that the 2015 schedule is posted on the IBS website. He stated there are 39 clubs holding matches and a total of 260 matches. 2015 National Championship matches will be held at the following ranges: Group- Union county, Score- Augusta, ME, 600 yard- Vapor Trail, MO, and 1000 yard- Hawks Ridge, NC.

2nd Vice President and awards Chairman John Cascarino gave the report. John gave a power point presentation explaining how IBS awards are sent to each match director. John keeps detailed spreadsheets documenting shipments. Jeff Stover thanked John for his great organizational skills.

The Long Range Committee report was given by Stanley Taylor. Stanley stated that in both disciplines there was a zero change in attendance. Stanley stated ways to help attendance and help the future of the sport. He mentioned the Georgia club offering to help first year shooters by paying the first \$25.00 of the membership to IBS. Long Range #2 Amend Rifle Muzzle Position Rule

Section 111.N (page 14) "Position on Bench". In all registered tournaments for any class of competition the rifle shall be so place that the muzzle extends forward of the bench and the entire receiver of the rifle is behind the firing line.

Amend this section with the added sentence: "This rule does not apply to any form of Long Range competition"

Approved by the following mailed in vote: 193 yes 68 no 8 no votes.

New Business:

Presidents report:

IBS President Jeff Stover gave a power Point presentation. Jeff thanked the Executive Board, Committees, webmaster Dick Grosbier, and Joan Borden for their efforts for the organization. Thanks to IBS points keepers: 600 yard- Mike Hanes, 1000 yard Phillip Yott, Group- Brian Dolinsky, Score- Wayne France, and Precision Rifleman- Herb Llewellyn. Jeff also thanked Jamie Hammer for her work as IBS Social Media Director. Jamie set up and maintains the IBS Face book page. A thanks to the committee (Terry Balding, Jim Bauer, Mike Wallace, Harley Baker, and David Apple) for volunteering to do a comprehensive rewrite of the rule book.

Jeff's report included many graphs pertaining to expenses of the organization, number of shooters and many more informative facts. Full write of power point is on the IBS website. Jeff spoke about the partnership with accurateshooter.com. He said positives were higher profile for IBS and benchrest. IBS shooting is featured on the world's largest stage for accuracy shooters. Last year, the IBS Executive Board approved paying \$250 to the person responsible to report on the shoots for accurateshooter.com. One of the goals for 2015 is to work on an updated rulebook.

Proposed 2015 rule changes:

LR#1

Request for a Long Range rule change Background:

IBS Long Range rules provide for three Courses of Fire:

Heavy Gun using Relays and shoot-offs to determine winners for IBS club competitions Light Gun using relays and shoot-offs to determine winners for IBS clubs competitions IBS Nationals using aggregate scoring to determine winners

These courses of fire limit IBS competition in that all competitors must be in attendance at the same range on the same day.

We are requesting that an additional course of fire, "Postal Matches" be added to the Long Range rules. Note that the intent is that a Club match would be designated as also being a Postal match, with aggregate scoring used only for the Postal Match portion of the competition.

Informal postal matches have been conducted for many years between the Australian 1000 yard and Virginia 1000 yard Benchrest Clubs. This competition would be formalized under this rule change. In the future, postal matches may be held between IBS clubs located in different parts of the USA, or between long range clubs located in different countries at the discretion of the individual club match directors.

Requested changes to IBS Long Range Rules section F(3)

F(3) Course of fire- IBS Nationals and Postal Matches

The 1000 yard Nationals and Postal matches will be fired using an aggregate format of at least 2 targets per class (light and heavy gun) with the option to add additional targets if the club determines they can complete the match with additional time needed based on available range facilities. The course of fire to be used for an given year will be decided for IBS nationals when the championships are awarded to the hosting club at the IBS meeting. and for Postal matches course of fire to be used for any given year will be decided by the participating club match directors. The format for the Championships will be clearly stated in all advertising for the Championships so that competitors have a clear understanding of the format that will be used each year.

Motion made by Randy Jarvis and a 2nd by Jim Bauer to table this item.

LR#2

Amend rulebook in Section VII.A.7 (long Range) to remove requirement of 1/2" clearance between a rest's sandbag container/retainer and any part of the rifle. Replace with "A front sandbag must maintain 1/2" in thickness and must be the only means of support at the rifle's forend".

Motion to accept this agenda item made by Jim Bauer with a 2nd by Shannon Lowman. **Agenda item passed**
