





Where do your IBS dues go? Total Expenses \$41,405


2013 IBS Expenses




2004-2014 Short Range Competition Trends - # of Unique Shooters

Total 1000 Yard Shooters 2007-2014 (# shown is number of persons earning points








Fewer matches may be better...

- By-laws changes approved to:
 - Enable EBoard to institute electronic voting
 - Allow President to add up to two persons to each discipline committee to ensure geographic representation



Accurateshooter.com Partnership Results:

- Resulted in much higher profile for IBS and benchrest
- Encouraged match directors to submit MUCH better and richer information to IBS, Dick Grosbier and accurateshooter.com
- IBS shooting is featured on the world's largest stage for accuracy shooters
- Membership from 2015 has only fallen from 53 from the 983 in January 2014

2014 "Misses" or Incomplete:

- Somewhat inconsistent reporting of results, match summary and photos for accurateshooter.com
- Need new scoring software for all disciplines
- Comprehensive update to IBS Rule Book

2015 Goal – A Clean Rulebook

- Updated rulebook in process
 - Bifurcate the IBS rulebook into Long and Short Range to eliminate confusion
 - Clean up long-standing LR issues
 - Fix the myriad of inconsistent DQ rules in shortrange
- Requires By-Laws Change in 2015
- Cannot go into effect until 2016

Do you try to squeeze the maximum accuracy from your hunting or varmint rifle?

Do you enjoy competition with some of the friendliest shooters around?

Would you like to improve your shooting skills?

Would you like to learn all aspects of precision shooting from those that really know?

Do you like to have FUN shooting?

Then benchrest shooting may be for you!

You can try shooting either of the 100/200 yard benchrest discipines, group, score or BOTH. Shooting group entails trying to put all five shots through the same hole-or nearly so. A well-tuned competition rifle will be able to put five shots into .150" or less, measured center to center of the two widest shots. Many targets can be covered by a dime with lots of room to spare. The Score discipline requires equally accurate rifles, but the object for that game is to hit five separate bullseyes. A perfect target would be 50-5x.
