

IBS Score Shooter of the Year Rules for 2018

Program Operating Rules

1. The Score Shooter of the Year season will be March 1 to November 15
2. Points will be awarded for all IBS registered matches that are listed on the IBS web site at least 30 days prior to the date of the event.
3. Year-end standing will be determined by points earned in only the shooters best 10 events.
4. A competitor must shoot all matches in a yardage or meterage to be counted. There will be a minimum requirement of 2 shooters for points to be awarded.
5. Every competitor shooting a 250 in the Six Power class will receive 1 point.
6. Hunter and Varmint Hunter classes will compete as one Six Power class. Points will be awarded based solely on the Rifle shot on the earliest relay.
7. LVFS and HVFS will compete as one class. Points will be awarded based solely on the Rifle shot on the earliest relay.
8. End of the year ties will be broken by; 1. The number of 1st place wins in the best 10 matches; 2. The number of 2nd place finishes in the best 10 matches; 3. The number of 3rd place finishes in the best 10 matches. Ties will be broken by this method for the top 5 places. All others will be ties.
9. Match reports must be sent to Wayne France, 6223 Wilmette Drive, Burke, VA 22015. Match reports need to be forwarded within one month of match completion. If the match results are posted on the website, a copy to Wayne will not be necessary. Only match reports received by Dec 1st each year will be eligible for inclusion in SSOY determination.
10. Host club will be responsible for holding all first yardage targets in case they need to be submitted to records committee. When you have multiple days of shooting, the targets cannot leave the range and still be eligible for record submission.
11. VFS and 6x points are calculated the same.

Non-National Championships Points

For multi yardage/meterage matches:

- 1 point per shooter for each yardage/meterage.
- 2 points per shooter for the grand aggregate.

Example if 20 people attend,

- 1st place at each distance earns 20 points, 20th place earns 1 point.
- Grand Aggregate winner earns 40 points, 20th place earns 2 points.

Shoots that consist of only a single yardage/meterage will be awarded 1.5 points / shooter, # of shooters X 1.5 for 1st place, decreasing by 1.5 points / position.

Example if 20 people attend,

- 1st place earns 30 points, 20th place earns 1.5 points.

National Championships Points

The Nationals will earn the same points as Non-Nationals AND the top 20 in Grand will earn BONUS points of 20 points for 1st place, 1 point for 20th place. Distance top 10 will earn 10 points for 1st place, 1 point for 10th place.

The Nationals BONUS points are in addition to points earned.

- Example, if a sweep of 1st place at the Nationals with 50 shooters would be a total of $200 + \text{Bonus points of } 40 = 240$

VARMINT FOR SCORE

Traveling Trophy

Plaques will be awarded 1st – 10th place

Certificates will be awarded 11th – 20th place

6 POWER

Traveling Trophy

Plaques will be awarded 1st – 5th place

Certificates will be awarded 6th – 10th place

ROOKIE

Plaques will be awarded 1st – 3rd place

Certificates will be awarded to all shooters having completed 5 matches.

IBS Score Shooter Rookie of the Year 2018 Rules

The Score Shooter Rookie of the Year program will run from March 1, through November 15.

A Rookie shooter is considered to be any new shooter who is in their first two calendar years of Benchrest competition. (New shooter means new to Benchrest- any participation in more than two registered BR matches of any type in NBRSA or IBS would constitute that the person had shot benchrest).

Rookie shooters are required to declare their rookie status on the shoot registration cards.

A shooter can only win Rookie of the Year once and will then become ineligible, regardless of the number of participation years

Match reports must designate the shooter is a rookie shooter.

To qualify for the rookie of the year program a shooter must compete in a minimum of five IBS registered 100 or 200- yard aggregates. The total of the five best yardage aggregates shot during the shooting season will become the shooters end of the year score.

The highest score shot in the first qualifying aggregate will break end of year ties, if a tie still exist the second, third, fourth, and fifth aggregates will be used until the tie is broken.

Varmint for Score and Hunter/ Varmint Hunter rookie of the year will be awarded at the IBS annual meeting.
